

At Valley, we value teaching God's inspired and infallible Word, His truth, to our students K-12 in our Religion/Theology classes as well as across the curriculum (English Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies, Art, Music, and more!) and even within our extra-curricular opportunities (Sports, Drama, Robotics, and more). We strive to teach Christ in all that we do, as this is one of the most important ways that Valley is *More Than A School*.

Equipping students with God's truths prepares them for their lives this side of heaven and for eternity. It is important to us that they know Jesus is the ONLY Way, Truth, and Life. He is our hope and our future. We want them to know Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior, how much Christ loves them, and to be equipped with God's armor as found in Ephesians 6:14-17.

Our Biblical Foundation

At Valley Lutheran School, the Bible is the cornerstone from which springboards all that we believe. Our school is grounded in the Lutheran faith, but Valley is open to students of all Christian faith traditions. Our student body represents 30+ churches throughout the Cedar Valley. Our school was founded and is supported by eight area LCMS and AALC Lutheran churches.

- We believe that Jesus Christ is our personal Lord and Savior.
- We believe that the Bible is the inspired and inerrant Word of God.
- We believe we are saved by grace (it's God's free gift) through faith alone (and not by our works).
- We believe that Jesus, being truly God and truly human, lived to fulfill God's Law for us. He died on the cross to pay the penalty our sins deserve, and He rose from the dead. All those who believe in Jesus as Savior will be given eternal life.

- We believe that there is one God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- We believe in the three universal creeds of the Christian faith.
- We believe that baptism and holy communion are sacred rites that God uses to offer us His grace.



Our ministry theme for this school year is "Abide in Christ" based upon 1 John 4:13: "By this we know that we abide in Him and He in us, because He has given us of His Spirit.". As Webster's puts it, abide means "living or dwelling within". We are invited in faith, through the workings of the Holy Spirit, to live or dwell within Christ as He first lives and dwells within us. In faith, we come to know Jesus as God's Son and our Lord and Savior. In faith, we understand that Christ's presence in our lives is essential as He is the only Way, Truth, and Life (John 14:6). It is only through Him that we have the assured hope of living with God now in this life and for eternity.





Our students come together periodically in chapel families - either K-5th, weekly, or K-12th, about once a month. These mixed-age groups of students are an opportunity for the older students in the group to have practice at leading a family group. Depending on the activity, it allows them to lead the question time or service activity, resulting in practical experience in a controlled environment with walking out their faith. Mixed-age groups allow our younger students a safe place to explore their faith and see true leaders in Christ in action. We are blessed to have these mini families within the larger Valley family - another way we are able to keep the feel of our growing school small.

Middle School Highlight

8th Grade Serves

During their 8th grade class trip in April 2025 to Minneapolis, the members of our 8th grade class had a chance to serve at Second Harvest Heartland. This organization is a leading hunger-relief institution that partners with more than 1,000 food shelves and hunger-relief programs in Minnesota and western Wisconsin. Our 8th graders were a part of a larger group that helped sort and package over 20,000 pounds of potatoes!

New: Senior Project

K - 8th Principal

From a Christian perspective, teaching is not merely about attaining knowledge but about understanding God's truth as the foundation for all subject content. At Valley, a Biblical worldview is integrated throughout our curriculum, helping children see how every academic discipline - from science to history - connects to God's grand narrative of creation, fall, and redemption.

This holistic approach nurtures moral and spiritual growth alongside intellectual development. It teaches children core values like honesty, integrity, and compassion, helping them build a strong character. By learning to think critically through a Biblical lens, children are better equipped to navigate cultural ideas and use their education for God's purposes. It transforms learning into an act of worship and stewardship, where students use their God-given gifts for His glory.

Growing Enrollment

Educational Savings Accounts (ESAs) through the State of Iowa have made an education at Valley financially attainable for many more families. Over the last 4 years, we have seen an average of 30% growth year to year, school-wide. We anticipated a jump in our Kindergarten enrollment for this school year, leading us to open a second Kindergarten room.

Growth is not just happening at the natural entry point of Kindergarten. Our Middle School grew by a whopping 21% this year! We are so thankful for the opportunity to partner with parents and other caregivers to raise up leaders for Christ in our community.

Reasons parents chose Valley:

- Faith-filled curriculum
- Small class size
- Academically challenging
- "Traditional" subjects taught (math facts, spelling words, cursive handwriting, etc.)

Growing our Teaching Team



Our growing enrollment spurred the growth of our ministry team by 2.5 positions. We are blessed by the level of excellence these additions bring to our team.

K-12 Spanish

The 2024-2025 school year was the first in which Valley offered Spanish instruction to students in Kindergarten through 12th grade.



- In our Elementary, Spanish was added as a "specials" class once a week.
- Spanish 1, taken over two years as a Middle School student, has been added to the classes for which a student will receive high school credit.
- By allowing Spanish 1 credit during a student's middle school years, High School students easily have room in their schedule for a second year to fulfill their graduation requirements. Many will go on to take Spanish 3 and 4.

MAP Testing: 3rd - 8th Grade

As part of our National Lutheran School Accreditation, we are required to administer a nationally standardized test. But beyond this requirement, a standardized test provides our administration and teachers with valuable information. Since they are a common benchmark, it ensures fairness by using the same questions and scoring for all students, which allows for accurate comparisons of performance and aids in making informed decisions about curriculum and instruction.


Since ESAs were established for the 2022-2023 school year, our 3rd - 8th grade classes have seen 63% growth. We transitioned to the national MAP test for these grade levels in 2022-2023 and have seen consistent growth in our students year to year - students who previously attended public school, were homeschooled, or have attended Valley since Kindergarten.




PRE-ACT: Freshman & Sophomores

PreACT is an online assessment for freshman and sophomores, created by ACT, Inc., that mirrors the full ACT test in structure and content to predict students' future performance and college readiness. It assesses English, Math, Reading, and Science skills, providing feedback to help students and educators with ACT test preparation and academic planning.

PreACT scores predict how students will perform on the actual ACT test when taken as a junior or senior. Scores range from 1 to 36 and are a composite score (the average of the four areas covered).





AP National Testing

Students at Valley have the option to take seven Advanced Placement (AP) classes that conclude with a college-level exam. The exam is administered by the College Board. Across the country, high school students take it each May to earn college credit and placement at universities. The tests are scored on a 1-5 scale, with scores of 3 or higher generally considered passing, though each college decides the scores required for credit. AP classes and exams demonstrate a student's commitment to rigorous coursework and can help them skip introductory college courses, potentially saving time and money.

Extra Curiculars



E Robotics

During the 2024-2025 season, Valley's First Tech Challenge (FTC) team, CrossFire, placed first at the League (district) Tournament, ensuring their automatic birth to State. The team also took home the Design Award for the construction of their robot. At the Iowa State Championship, the team finished 13th in their division of 72 teams and was awarded the 3rd place Connect award. This is the 3rd time in 4 years that Valley's FTC has made State. Way to go, FTC!

Valley's Board of Directors is made up of individuals representing Valley's eight Association Congregations, plus a pastor from both the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) and The American Association of Lutheran Churches (AALC). These individuals are committed to investing in the students of Valley, responding to their diverse needs, enriching Valley's programs, and retaining top-quality faculty and staff.

Provided on the next slides are a synopsis of the Growing Generations Capital Campaign and our yearly budget needs. As a dad of three graduates with our youngest set to graduate this year, I've seen first hand the impact a Lutheran Christian education has had for my family. I pray the information provided gives you further insight into Valley's robust and growing ministry.

Growing Generations Capital Campaign

Since its kickoff in the spring of 2024, our Growing Generations Capital Campaign has focused on raising funds over and above our general budget to expand Valley's instructional and office space. Through the generosity of donors and God's blessing, our new entrance, administrative offices, atrium, two Kindergarten classrooms, School Success classroom, and remodeled gymnasium have been accomplished.

Growing Generations Our Immediate Need: \$825,000

For the 2025-2026 school year, every inch of our current serviceable space is being used daily to address the needs of educating 193 students.

The next project phase is to complete four classrooms in the unfinished southeast corner of our building. These additional classrooms have an approximate cost of \$1.1 million. Valley's Board of Directors has decided that 75% of the cost must be raised in new or additional pledges or donations before moving forward. That's an additional \$825,000 that is needed. Our goal is to begin construction by January so that the rooms will be completed by fall.



Educational Savings Accounts (ESAs) through the State of lowa have made an education at Valley financially attainable for many more families. 2025-2026 is the first year every student in the state of lowa qualifies, as long as their status is full-time and the application guidelines are fulfilled. This program is a huge blessing to the families at Valley!

Additional Financial

Solutheran Tuition Organization: \$89,252

The Iowa Lutheran School Tuition Organization assists families who desire a K-12 Lutheran education for their children. Awards are based on income and help reduce the family portion of tuition. This school year, 65 families received funds.

© Crusader Family Service Grant: 1,750+ hours

We value each family's partnership! Our Crusader Family Service Grant allows participating families who give 20 hours of service to receive \$100 off of tuition per child the following school year when they give of their time and talents. These requirements were completed by 23 families. We are already seeing hours turned in for next year!

Assistance

Since ESAs do not fully cover the cost of tuition, many Valley families take advantage of these additional programs to offset the parent portion of tuition.

(\$) Local Church Assistance

Several local churches budget grants for their members to assist in the parent portion of tuition. This year over 40 students received grants.

True Cost of Education:

In order to keep tuition reasonable for families, the difference between the true cost of education and what parents are charged for tuition must be raised through third-party funding. Several of our big events, for instance our Crusader Knight that happens each spring, serve as fundraisers for our general budget - labeled as our Crusader Fund. However, most of this difference comes through the generosity of individual donors.

For the 2025-2026 school year, Valley's Board of Directors made raising teacher salaries and safeguarding a competitive benefits package a priority. They felt that caring well for one of our most valuable resources, our teachers, ensures the success of our students and, therefore, our school.


General Budget: 3rd Source Funding Needed

In May 2025, the Valley Board of Directors passed a budget that went into effect on July 1st. For the 2025-2026 school year, \$720,000 is needed in third-source funding prior to June 30, 2026. Each dollar given guarantees the continuation of our vision:




